

How to Prepare For Your Hemorrhoid Banding Treatment

Going in for Hemorrhoid Banding? Here's what to expect.

You've been diagnosed with hemorrhoids and you've done your research to learn that hemorrhoid banding is the right choice for your situation, but you're not sure what to expect from the procedure. Here's why the CRH O'Regan System is often the first choice for non-surgical hemorrhoid treatment.

No Fasting

Unlike other hemorrhoid treatment options, there's really nothing you need to do to prepare for your CRH O'Regan hemorrhoid banding procedure. Once your physician has determined you're a candidate for hemorrhoid banding treatment, in some cases, they can treat you immediately.

No Pain

The CRH O'Regan System uses a proprietary procedure to place a band at the base of the hemorrhoid, where there are no pain-sensitive nerve endings. We use a gentle suction to bring the tissue forward, and then place a single band around the hemorrhoid. The majority of our patients report that they feel no pain from the banding. A slight fullness or sense of pressure in the rectum is normal and should resolve within a few hours.

Should you feel a pinch, any pain, or discomfort during or immediately after your procedure, let your physician know so they can fix it before you leave their office.

No Waiting

Our banding treatment for hemorrhoids usually takes less than 60 seconds. That's it. In the time it takes to read this article, you could have had the procedure done and been a step closer to eliminating the pain and discomfort of hemorrhoids.

No Downtime

While other hemorrhoid treatments may require extensive recovery restrictions and significant downtime, CRH patients are able to return to work the same or next day.

No Problem

The CRH O' Regan hemorrhoid banding system can be used for about 99% of all hemorrhoid sufferers, and by using a single-use, disposable device, we're able to eliminate the risk of contamination. To further minimize complications, the CRH O'Regan System treats one hemorrhoid at a time (treating more than one hemorrhoid at a time can increase the chance of complications by up to 10x). Most patients require three treatments (one for each of the hemorrhoidal columns), but start feeling relief after just one.
