The ASGE suggests that an effective, proficient physician should find adenomatous polyps in at least 30% of screening colonoscopies performed on males over age 50 and 20% for females meeting the same criteria - our physicians far surpassed the national guidelines.

Cecal Withdrawal Time



Cecal withdrawal time is the amount of time a physician spends examining the colon for polyps and other abnormalities. A six-minute examination is the accepted recommendation by ASGE — to ensure a thorough exam and better likelihood of detecting abnormalities in the colon. At Digestive Care Center, we document the cecal withdrawal time on every colonoscopy we perform — ensuring they examine each patient's colon carefully and methodically — and far exceeding the nationally recognized standard.
